CORRECTIONS TO A PRELIMINARY LIST OF THE SALTICIDAE OF MINNESOTA. Bruce Cutler

Recent captures have necessitated a few changes in the checklist published in *Peckhamia* 1(3):40. *Agassa cyanea* (Hentz) and *Marpissa lineata* (C. L. Koch) are to be added. *Metaphidippus montanus* (Emerton) is deleted, this specimen actually represents an aberrant male *M. insignis* (Banks). I have several examples of males of this species with atypical emboli from several localities in the state. The correct citation for *Pellenes wrighti* is Gertsch, not Lowrie and Gertsch. With the deletions and additions, there are now 60 species of salticids known from Minnesota.
