

**JUMPING SPIDERS OF THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA: CHANGES IN THE KEY AND LIST (1).**

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Catalog numbers which accompany each correction refer to those provided with the original list in PECKHAMIA 1(5).

3. ***Attinella dorsata*** (Banks) 1895 = *Sitticus absolutus* Gertsch and Mulaik 1936. The type was not destroyed as previously thought, but is apparently at the MCZ. As a result, both the genus *Attinella* (which becomes a junior synonym of *Sitticus*) and entry No. 3 must be deleted from the list. *S. absolutus* also becomes *S. dorsatus* (Banks). 189. ***Pellenes tachypodus*** (*Habronattus*) (Chamberlin and Ivie) is also known from Florida.
193. m ***trimaculatus*** (*Habronattus*) (Bryant) 1945: 187, fig.11. FL.
240. mf ***toro*** Edwards 1978: 80-82, fig. 5-10. AZ.
246. mf ***xeros*** Edwards 1978: 77-79, fig. 1-4. FL.
263. mf ***dorsatus*** (*Attus*) (Banks) 1895: 97. As noted above, *S. absolutus* is a junior synonym.

Several difficulties also exist in the key to North American genera (PECKHAMIA 1(5)): Wayne Maddison found that the female *Bianor* keys to *Sassacus*. Bruce Cutler also noted that at least some *Chalcoscirtus* have more than two unpaired spines, and some *Euophrys* have one retromarginal tooth. It is hoped that these problems can be corrected in the near future.
